We all know the story of more recent years: Mayor of the City of North Bay, MPP for Nipissing and his most recent posting as the Honourable Minister of Finance. Congratulations Victor.







bids & tenders

The City of North Bay is pleased to introduce bids&tenders[™] as their new eProcurement platform and will be joining hundreds of other purchasing organizations in posting their bid opportunities exclusively on bids&tenders[™]. The City of North Bay will transition to using bids&tenders[™] in two phases; starting November 6th as part of Phase 1, all bid opportunities will be posted on bids&tenders[™] for viewing and downloading. Submission of bids will continue to be in-person and by mail courier.

Phase 2 Implementation in early 2019 features electronic submission of all bids. This provides the following additional features:

• Automated confirmation when your bid has been submitted, received, or withdrawn.

• Ability to work on a bid, save your work, and see the bid-closing countdown in real time.

- Ability to withdraw and change your bid, then resubmit if desired.
- Built-in calculator that does the math for you no need to worry about math errors.
- Built-in compliancy checker so you know your bid is compliant before you submit.
- Built-in reminders sent to you if a bid has been started but not submitted.
- 100% electronic submission.
